ANALYSIS:

<u>Academics</u>: Students at LMS engage in challenging, rigorous, enriching, Standards-based activities such as Model United Nations, Hippocrates Circle, Rube Goldberg Machine Contest, Band and Orchestra, Korean language and culture, Yearbook, Stage Crew, and Leadership.

<u>Social Emotional Health</u>: Our Conflict Resolution Program known as Heart Group is designed to teach students how to manage conflicts more constructively by learning empathy- based peer mediation procedures.

<u>Student Voice</u>: Through our collaboration with the Quaglia Institute for School Voice and Aspirations, LMS throws an annual World Café where students share knowledge, generate ideas, and use their voice to enact changes that will best serve their academic and social-emotional health.

<u>Professional Development</u>: LMS Staff participates in weekly professional development opportunities that are anchored in peer collaboration across disciplines. Our aim is to apply the co-construction of knowledge in the context of these shared enterprises in a unified curriculum.

Awards and Recognition: Lawrence is proud to be a Magnet Schools of America School of Excellence. Our Gifted Magnet was awarded School of Distinction by Magnet Schools of America. Lawrence was awarded a WASC Accreditation for our high-quality learning model and our commitment to continual self-improvement.

One group we would like to focus on particularly is our 7th graders who have expressed a desire for activities that are unique to them.

As we move into the new school year, we are hoping to find a sponsor (or sponsors) for our 7th graders so that they can feel empowered as the voice of this pivotal transitional grade.

Another activity we would like to begin is the "Sit With Wisdom" lunch gathering where several teachers invite two or three students to have lunch with them. The goal is to give students who may not normally be asked how they feel about campus life an opportunity to share their views and become a part of the collaborative conversation.



We will continue to offer every student an opportunity to participate in the "I Know My Class" survey in each of their classes early in the Spring Semester.
