The My Voice National Student Report 2013 is based on results of the My Voice Student Survey, facilitated by the Quaglia Institute of Student Aspirations (QISA) and Pearson Foundation to measure students' perceptions of school. The survey yields crucial data related to self worth, engagement and purpose – all vital to fostering student aspirations.

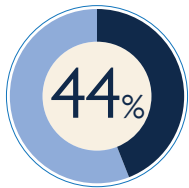

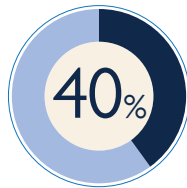

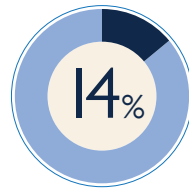
What happens at school impacts academic motivation



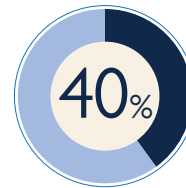

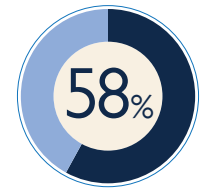

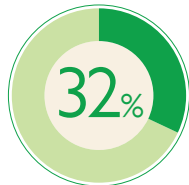
