## **Strategies to Support Aspirations**

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The teacher-generated strategies below support students on their Aspirations journeys. Remember that the quadrants are fluid—a student may appear to be in Hibernation at one point during a class or semester, yet Aspiration at another time.

<ul> <li>Utilize <u>culturally</u> relevant strategies</li> <li>Facilitate an <u>"If You Really Knew Me"</u> activity</li> <li>Arrange for an informal mentor to connect with a student for two minutes every day</li> <li>Ensure assignments are appropriately <u>challenging</u>—not too easy or too hard</li> <li>Foster peer support</li> <li><u>Chunk</u> work into manageable parts</li> <li>Connect assignments and your examples to students' <u>interests</u></li> <li>Set up achievable short-term goals (hourly, daily, weekly)</li> <li>Provide <u>choice</u> in assignments</li> <li>Re-evaluate the <u>setup</u> of your classroom</li> <li>Use <u>gaming strategies</u></li> <li>Include student-selected topics of study</li> <li>Provide <u>guided</u> notetaking templates</li> <li>Take real and <u>virtual</u> field trips</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Encourage students to sketch/doodle/journal</li> <li>Support divergent thinking</li> <li>Incorporate improv games</li> <li>Flip the learning in your classroom</li> <li>Ask students to articulate the purpose of lessons and the importance of subjects they're studying</li> <li>Allow students to direct projects</li> <li>Have students complete an interest profile</li> <li>Discuss work/career interests and possible paths to achieving personal goals</li> <li>Have students interview others about their goals and aspirations</li> <li>Include assignments that will not be graded</li> <li>Use collaborative learning</li> <li>Reward students' efforts</li> <li>Utilize vision boards</li> </ul>
