When students believe they have a voice they are 38% more likely to report Engagement.

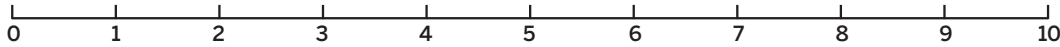

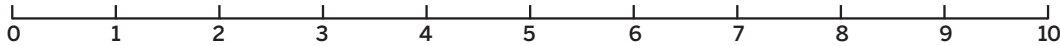


1. Our professional learning with staff models effective engagement practices.



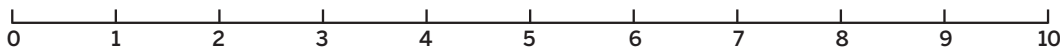

2. Our school values the learning process as much as learning outcomes.



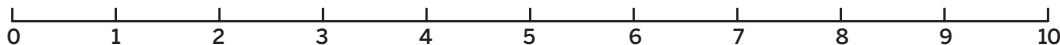

3. All classrooms strive to limit excessive lectures and actively involve students in their learning.



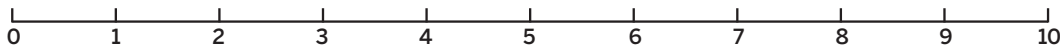
How do you know when students are engaged in their learning? How do you ensure a balance of teacher talk and student talk?

5. We involve students in school-wide planning and problem-solving.

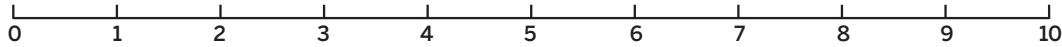


On which school-wide committees are students active members? What are their roles on those committees? Are a wide variety of students active on committees, or only a token few?

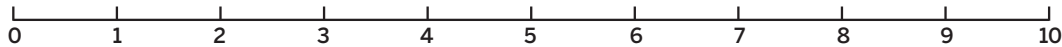


6. Our school regularly uses student feedback.



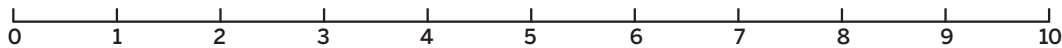

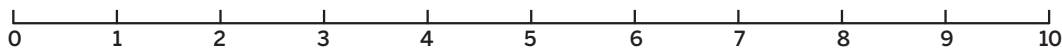

8. Teachers help students see the interconnectedness between their classes.



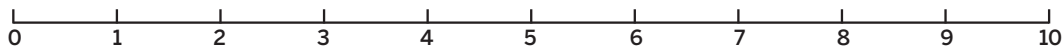
