My Voice is Special: Get Ready!

Students in grades 1-2

This series of four one-hour, live, online sessions is designed to introduce students in grades 1-2 to the concept of voice. What does it mean to use your voice to share your ideas? Does voice mean just being loud? Students will have fun learning about all the ways their voices are special. Students will receive a downloadable workbook, *Get Ready!*, to further explore voice and aspirations in the classroom and at home.

My Voice is Important: Let's Go!

Students in grades 3-6

This series of four one-hour, live, online sessions is designed to teach students the definition of voice and how they can use their voices to have a positive impact on others. Students will explore the difference between noise and voice. They will learn specific skills to listen more intently to others and to enhance their own voices. Students will receive a downloadable workbook, *Let's Go!*, to further explore voice and aspirations in the classroom and at home.

My Voice in Action: Stand Up, Speak Out!

Students in grades 7-12

This series of four ninety-minute, live, online sessions is designed to coach students in using their voices to make a difference in their school and community. Students will learn how to partner with adults to lead school change efforts and to productively use their voices to make a real difference. Utilizing their knowledge of voice, students will develop plans of action for personal, social, and academic growth. Students will receive a downloadable workbook, *Stand Up, Speak Out!*, to further explore voice and aspirations in the classroom and at home.
