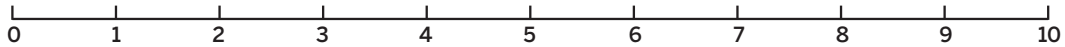

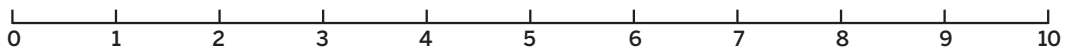

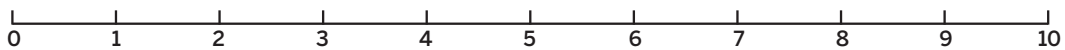
What impact on learning have you noticed firsthand when families partner with schools?

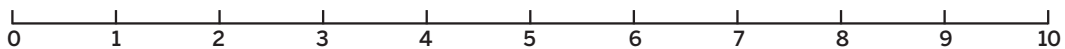

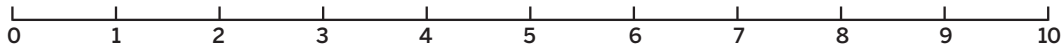

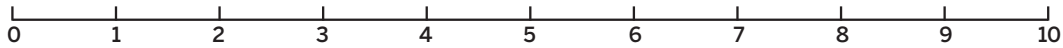

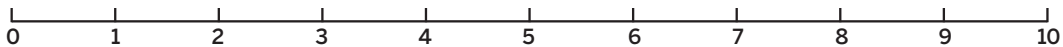

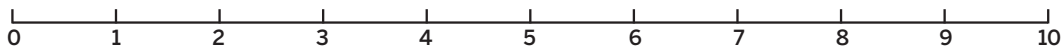

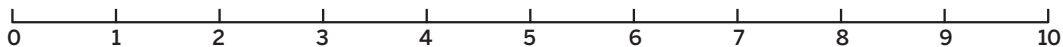
