### **Suggested Custom Questions for Student Voice (school survey)**

*Schools can add five custom questions.*

- Self-Worth*
- I know how to get help with my online classes.
  - I am putting forth effort to make my online learning experience successful.
  - I am able to connect with my peers during my online classes.
- Engagement*
- I enjoy online learning.
  - My teachers make online learning interesting.
  - It is challenging for me to pay attention during online classes.
  - I can easily connect online to attend my classes.
- Purpose*
- I know how to be successful in my online classes.
  - I think online learning is preparing me well for my future.
- Voice*
- I like online classes better than in-person classes.
  - I am comfortable sharing my ideas online.
  - My teachers are open to students' suggestions about online learning.
  - I have ideas for how to improve online learning for everyone.

### **Suggested Custom Questions for iKnow My Class (classroom survey)**

*Teachers can add three custom questions.*

#### *Perceptions of Oneself in the Learning Process*

- I participate in online discussions during this class.
- I limit outside distractions during my online sessions for this class.
- I review online lessons for this class more than once.
- I feel successful with my online learning in this class.

#### *Perceptions of the Course Overall*

- There are minimal distractions and interruptions during this online class.
- This class is preparing me well for my future.
- I prefer taking this class online rather than in person.

#### *Perceptions of the Teacher and Instruction*

- The teacher makes online learning interesting.
- The teacher enjoys teaching online.
- The teacher is open to students' ideas and suggestions.
- The teacher limits the amount of time lecturing.
- The teacher is patient with students' struggles related to online learning.
