

Student Voice

There are three parts to student voice:

1. Feeling comfortable sharing your ideas in a safe space
2. Sharing realistic ideas that help everyone
3. Being responsible and taking action

Student voice is a way for *you* to be actively involved in your classroom and school. When you share your ideas and work toward making school better for everyone, you are making a difference! Keep in mind that you do not have to be loud to share your ideas. You just have to be willing to let others know what you are thinking.

Let's Explore Student Voice!

Part 1: BE COMFORTABLE SHARING IDEAS

Sometimes our ideas are productive and meaningful. That is called VOICE. Other times our ideas are more about complaining, and that is called NOISE. See how each NOISE thought below was turned into VOICE.

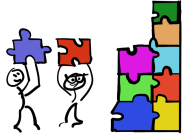
