

Class Ambassadors provides an important opportunity for Student Voices to be valued and heard at school. Every month two representatives are selected to represent each class. Twice a month the Ambassadors will attend a meeting with the Principal's Aspirations Council (PAC) and elected Student Council members. We recommend schools hold PAC meetings with K-2 Ambassadors, and with 3-5 Ambassadors separately.

Prior to the PAC meeting, Ambassadors are asked to gather information from their class on the following questions (or other questions determined by the school) and be prepared to share at the meeting:

- What is going well at school?
- What ideas do you have for improving school?

Share the [Voice Definition](#) with the Ambassadors and ask them to keep this in mind as they gather feedback from their class:

1. Sharing thoughts & ideas in an environment underpinned by trust & respect
2. Offering realistic suggestions for the good of the whole
3. Accepting responsibility for not only what is said, but what needs to be done

Student Council and Administration will also have information they will share and ask Ambassadors to take back to and share with their class. Class Ambassadors may also be called upon during their month of service to support the school in other ways such as helping with school events, leading school tours, participating in focus groups, etc.

The following are pictures from work being done at Kihei Elementary School in Maui, Hawaii to amplify Student Voice in partnership with their Dolphin Ambassadors. In addition to regular meetings, Dolphin Ambassadors have engaged in leadership training with Student Leaders at a local high school and are in charge of a weekly school broadcast.
