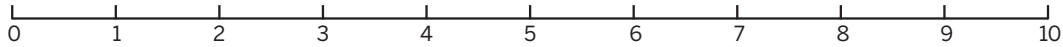

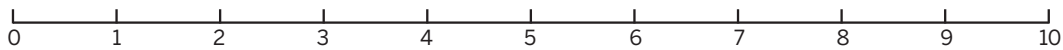

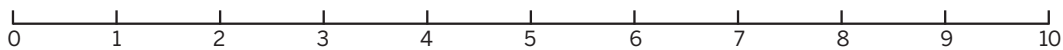
How do you build positive relationships with students at your school?

2. Students know I respect their ideas and insights.



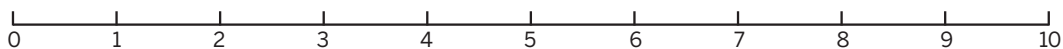
How do you show students you respect their voices?

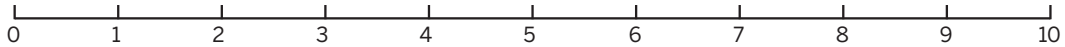

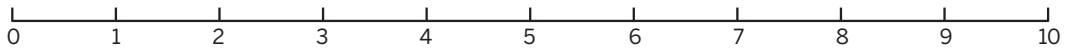

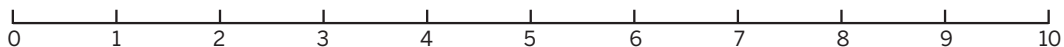

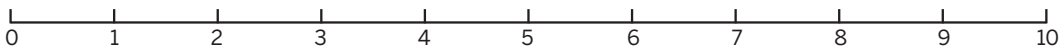
